> Roger's Notebook by Roger E. PH.D.

Are you a boy or a girl? That's usually the first thing someone wants t know about you. The world we live in is divided into sexes. Men and woman do different things. There are punishments for those who dare to cross the line that divides the two.

Many people tend to deny some part of their being in order to survive with a minimum of harassment from other people. The crossdreser who has taken some time to explore his feelings (a feminine trait by the way) often wants to know more about these denied parts o his personality.

"Exploring femininity": It's a phrase often heard in gatherings of crossdressers and seen in articles written for crossdressers. Sometimes, however, it seems to me that all some crossdressers are interested in exploring are the more enjoyable aspects of the feminine world; nice clothes, makeup, going to parties, and so on. But this is only a partial view of women and the world they live in every day.

Femininity has little to do with the clothing women wear. What these clothes do is to identify the wearers as women (often with the unspoken message that they are first and foremost sex objects). If you take the time to watch women as they interact with other

people, you will see some behaviors that few men do on a routine basis.

For example, there is concern for other people's situations, sometimes to the point of denying themselves. many women put other people's needs ahead of their own. Mothers go without so that their children can have what they need. Wives give in to their husbands' desires to preserve harmony in the marriage. The examples are endless...

What does this have to do with you, the crossdresser? Probably very little if the only reason you crossdress is for personal reasons. If you wish to move beyond the immediate personal gratification and truly explore the femininity within you, then it is necessary for you to be aware of your interactions with other people.

When you are at a meeting, do you brag about how often you were able to pass or do you take the time to seek out that panic stricken person who is at his first meeting and doesn't know what to do? If you have an understanding partner, are you sensitive to her feelings about your crossdressing? If you do not have and understanding partner, do you take the time to understand why she does not understand and empathize with your situation? Do you support her needs and feelings in either case?

Crossdressing is often an enjoyable experience...with new feelings and different roles to play. But if you had to wear women's clothing all the time, I suspect that you would find the demands placed on women are much less fun than you think they are.

On a wider scale, if you work at exploring and developing the feminine aspects of your personality, it can provide you with new information that will carry over into the male aspects of your life. Being "in tune" with those around you can make your everyday life less of a contest and more of a team

effort.
