NEWSLETTER

This is the official Fantasia Fair newsletter, which will be issued daily, except on weekends. It provides updated schedules and other information, which may differ from that in the three newsletters you received prior to arrival. Please read this newsletter carefully every day. You will find that communication is very difficult in Provincetown—there are no phones in the rooms, and the fair is spread out over several different hotels. You will need to consult the newsletter to be aware of daily activities.

Information which you want to appear in the newsletter should be submitted no later than 3:00 PM the day before it is to appear. Information may be left at the desk at Gifford House, or may be given either to Merissa Sherrill Lynn, the fair coordinator (Gifford House, Room 14) or to Elaine Willey, the newsletter editor (Crown and Anchor, Room 111). Please save all copies of the newsletter. Some information will not be repeated.

The newsletter will be delivered to your room late at night on the day preceding its effective date. In the case of very late (and essential) information, a supplementary 3x5 card may be included (hopefully this will not be necessary).
