CHI DELTA MU (CDM) can be described as a self help, support group for male, heterosexual crossdressers and families. CHI DELTA MU (CDM) is the tri-state chapter of The Society for the Second Self. CHI DELTA MU (CDM) provides for it's members (through meetings, discussion groups, socials, a library and referral system) a way to manage crossdressing in their lives. Because of the sensitive subject and nature of this organization, certain safeguards are utilized to avoid embarrasment. Code names and numbers, PO boxes, mail forwarding and codes of confidentiality are used to create a safe environment for members.

The stated purpose of the CHI DELTA MU is: To provide programs, speakers, services and socials, To provide safe opportunities for crossdressing, To provide assistance and support for alleviating domestic discord arising from crossdressing, To provide information on crossdressing to the public.

Membership is restricted. CDM is not an "open" group. Homosexual TV's, Bi- or fetish TV's and Transsexuals are referred to other groups. CDM makes no value judgement of open groups, but maintains a closed focus in order to better serve the needs of heterosexual crossdressers and their families

Thanks for your consideration.


