Because of my fossil status, very few current members have any idea of the enormous personal growth I experienced thanks to the nurturing of a few good people. Do you think you and others could obtain more enjoyment and benefit from our monthly meetings? Have you ever felt alone in a crowd of one hundred at our meetings? Would you enjoy a forum in which everybody could contribute?
