Sigma chi chapter ceases operbtion, merges ulth alpha

(Los Angeles, $C A$ ) -- After nearly a year of battling to create its oun identity, the Sigaa Chi chapter of Tri-Ess has decided to cease operation
After acting Signa Chi president Janyne Cresap announced her resignation and no chapter nenbers attended the nonination reeting in June, Cresap turned the Signa Chi aailing list over to Alpha chapter president Kyaberleigh Richards Richards mailed a letter to the Signa Chi nembership inviting then to attend Alpha reetings. Alpha subsidized the nailing of the final sigme chi nevsletter containing Cresap's farevell nessage to its neabers, and Ciesap has agreed to take over production of the Alpha neysletter beginning in Septenber
In Cresap's inal comunication as Sigal chi president, she admitted that the sain criticish of Alpha, "we never do anything ...but sit around and talke, was proven to be an indication of what the local neabership vants. Signa Chi, orned to counter that perception, had scheduled several. outside activities during the past several aonths, only to have thee sparsely attended. Responding to that statewnt, Richards raaftirned Alpha's golicy of providing 'a safe place to get together" lop its neubers, and pronised not to attempt to force its menbership into participating in prograns that its nenbers have not indicated a need or desire for
Signa Chi's denise comes just a little over a nonth before what would have been its first anniversary on August 4. [Christine Hochberg]

> COMPUTER TAMPERING ERASES PRRT OF VERNON'S MAIL LIST
(Walthat, MA) -- Folloving the eliaination of betveen 1,500 and 2,000 addresses fron their files, Vernon's Specialities has issued a call for help to all gender conaunily organizations.
vernun Porter, president of the vell-knoun conaunity business, said the elinination of the addresses from his fira's cumputer hard disk vas deliberate, but vould not elaborate. He is asking that any of his custoners who did not receive the store's May/June nevsletter or any expected correspondence to contact then linediately so that any discrepancies or onissions can be corrected.
The conputer incident is the third setback suffered by the store in the past nine nonths. On October 10 of last year, an araed gunman held up the store shortly after it opened for the day The qunam drove off vith a safe police say contained at least $\$ 10,000$. Two veeks earlier, thieves had thrown a cinder block through the store's reap door and ransacked a cash register.

## MARINES HELD IN TU DEATH IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY

(Oceanside, CA) -- Two Canp Pendleton Marines have been booked into county jail in connection vith the slaying last Decenber 10 of a rransvestite prostitute in the driveray of a Oceanside notel (January 'g " "Cross-Talk")
jeffrey Todd Hanoons and Todd Alan Thornton, both 24, have been charged vith aurder and robbery and are being held on $\$ 500,000$ bail, a jail spokesvonan said. They vere scheduled to be arraigned May 24 in Vista aunicipal court, she said
Hamoons and Thornton were arrested hay 22 at the base by Oceanside police after a 5 f-zonth investigation into the aurder of Carlos Santiago, 25 , who vas also known as carlos Santana or "Tasha"
Santiago, who reportedly vas one of about a dozen
transvestite prostitutes vorking dountoun Dceanside, was
found dead fron a gunshot vound to the chest in the drivevay of the Wally Johnson hotel on North Hill Street. Police theorize that the killing nay have been proapted by custoner dissatisfaction.
Oceanside Police spokesaan Bob George said it took aonths for authorities to gather enough evidence to obtain warrants. The two marines, both corporals, reportedly completed a tour of duty in the Persian Gulf while the investigation ras undervay. They have not been linked to any of the other five slayings reported in San diego County last year in which the victios vere transvestites of transsexuals.
The other incidents include two transvestites found shot in the head June il near San Diego vild Aninal Park (August ' 90 "Cross-Talk"), both knoun prostitutes; a Moral Heights TV shot several tines in the head and stonach July $2 ;$ a transvestite prostitute pun over by a car on a Morth Park street Septenber 1 after fighting vith the coapanion of the car's driver; and a Tijuana transsexual found liovenber 23 on the side of the road on Sunrige Highvay (Decenber' 90 "Cross-Talk"). The Novenber incident has been linked to a five-year-old series of slayings of fanale prostitutes and drug addicts being investigated by the hetropolitan Honicide Task Forca.

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## FZM TS SUES PENNSYLUANIA for surgical procedures

(Philadelphia, $P A$ ) - A suit filed in April in federal court there is creating an interssting tuist on the oft-tried attempt to force the government or an insurance company to pay for sexual reass!gnment surgery

The suit claims that state Iepartnent of Public Welfare officials violated the civil rights of "Erik V.S." by denying hia surgery to nake nin physically aale. Unlike -to-f procedures, which are used only for transsexuals, the mastectony and hysterectony Erik seeks are routinely funded by medicare when necessary for the heal th of fenale patients
Eric's attorney, Stephen F. Gold, clains that state officials illegally discrininated against Erik because of his client's transsexualisa, and have violated the federal Medica! Assistance Act by denying payaents for necessary surgery
Epic was diagnosed as a transsexual in 1984, has been taking hormones since 1987, and has been punctioning and living as a male for several years. But because of earlier psychiatpic and redical problens, he is uneaployed and receives Social security and disability payments

Naned in the suit as defendants are Yelfare Secretary John F. White Jr. and Don Jose Stoval, adainistrator of the Philadelphia County Board of Assistance. Attorneys for the Welfare departnent had no coment on the suit

## FOUNDER OF SUAN'S INNER SORORITY DIES AT AGE 82

(Tralee, !reland) -- Elisabeth $P$. Svan, psychic healer and founder of Svan's Inner Sopority, died of heart failupe on March 29th at the age of 82
Ms. Swan vas born in 6lenbeigh, lreland, and entered into the craft of psychic healing at the age of 12 at hep father's encouragement. She left lreland at the age of 25 with an aunt and uncie, and lived !n Mey York City for any years. She becane a nurse and scholar, then noved to California at age 40 after nep father died and left hep a sall inheritance. She bought a house in the Santa Cpuz mountains and becane well-known as a hands-on healep.

She becane intrigued with the gender conaunity af ter meeting Vendi Seabreeze in 1986. The following year, a saall group called Swan's lnner Circle (later Syan's Innep Sorority) vas foraed, using netaphysical lessons uritten by its founder
In March of last year, after a yision of hep death, Ms. Suan returned to her honeland. She is suryived only by her adopted daughters of the Sorority.
She was cremated on April 3 , vith hep ashes spread across the bay of Ballyheige. A cosalc conounion and Plnal pite of passage was periormed by the Sororily's sisters June 26.

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## G.A.L. COMES OUT IN FRUOR OF SACRAMENTO LEGISLATION. SUGGESTS SIMILAR BILLS

(Napa, CA) -- While offeping eupport for a bill pending action by the Sacramento Cily Council, Gender Alternatives League National Executive Director Crnthia Hovard is suggesting that the bill could be a model for sinilar legaslative action in other iities
the bill, which vould modify the city's discriaination act to exclude age, gender identity, narital status, and physical appearance and/or disabilities as reasons for exclusion in employnent, access to businesses, real estate dealings, or cily business. The changes, which vere modeled after the Denver Civil Rights Act, would expand the scope of the existing city code banning discriaination based on sexual preference. The code already provides for civil action in the event of an business or individual's violation of its provisions.
in bringing the proposed changes to the attention of the gender comunity, Hovard said she believes the revised ordinance could be used as a mode! for change in other local and state discriaination ordinances and laws. She has called upon the comanity's leaders to research the issue and send copies of any existing naterial on the subject to GAL so that proposed legislation can be introduced in the aunicipality or state affected.
Hovard has also vritten a letter to the Anerican Psychiatric Association (APA) suggesting the addition of GAL's tera "genderist" with proper definition to the forthconing tourth revision of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (OSM-IV). She has also given notice to the APA that any use of the tera in conjunction with the psychiatric teras transvestite and transsexual vill not be tolerated by GAL. Hovard defines "genderist" is "any person tho is part of the $98 \%$ of the gender comaunity wich is aentally healthy and who because of preference or predisposition vishes to emulate the gender opposite his/her biological sex"

The letter to the APA goes on to object to the aforementioned psychiatric teras being applied to the entire comaunity, aaintaining that lass than 28 of the comunity have actually been examined by the profession. Howard further naintains that those examirations have been biased. She suggests that transgenderisa de doentified separately in the OSH-IV, and that it be specifically defined as "not a vental illness and genderists not mentally ill"

## TS BRITISH OISC JOCKEY CLAIMS OISCRIMINATION

(Exeter, England) -- A disc jockey who undervent a sex change says he yas fired as a an, then of fered less money to do the same job as a vonan.

Capolyne Jayne Monroe, who before undergoing two years of surgical procedures to becone a voman five years ago was known as blenn Richards, says she vas vas told by the new progran director at he radio station that her services as Richards are no longer required. Monroe said she vas then offered her old job as Carolyne, but for less money. In the interest of broadcasting consistency, she had continued on the aip using her old ale voice and persona despite a throat operafion to give her a more feninine voice.

Monroe clained the cut in vages vas not only an insult to her, but to all vomen. A spokesman for Devon-Air maintained that the company has never operated a sexually discriainatory pay policy, and said teras of the proposed contract with Monroe vere strictly confidential.

Local listeners vere surprised to discover that Richards and Monroe vere the same person, but said it was more iaportant what she sounds like than what she looks like

# BETTY ANN LINO RECEIUES PRINCE LIFETIME AUARD FROM I.F.G.E. 

(Denver, CO) -- Betty Ann Lind of Alexandria, Virginia, is the recipient of the 1991 virginia Prince Lifetial Contribution Avard
The Prince Avard is the highest and nost prestigious avard conferred by the internationa! Foundation for Gender Education (!FGE) and vithin the gender connunity. Previous recipients are: virginia Prince herself (1987); Merissa Sherrill Lynn (1988); Ariadne Kane (1989); and Sp. Mary Elizabeth, SSE (1990)
For Lind, the Prince Avard is the culaination of a lifetine of crossdressing that began in childhood in a hotel on a 'tree" street in the city of Chicago. Folloving a bout vith rheunatic fever around the age of five, Lind axperienced her first skirts when fenale playnates dressed hill as a gir! for "pretend ganes" and naned her "Betty" after the popular cartoon character Betty Boop.
Crossdressing experiences continued throughout Lind's childhood and early adulthood. Along the way Lind eapned a Master of Arts degree fron the University of Minnesota.
Lind co-founded the minnesota chaptep of FPE (Phi Pi Epsilon) in 1964. She served as the Mid-Atlantic coordinator for Tri-Ess fron 1976-1980 and has been the editor and publisher of the Outreach Institute's "Our Sopority ${ }^{\text {a }}$ fron ig78 to the present. Lind has held aany offices in various crossdressing organizations. Most recently she has been a nenber of the IFGE Board of Oirectors since 1987
Lind is no stranger to avards vithin the gender connunity. In 1980 she vas honored with the Tri-Ess Mational Service Avard; she yas also recognized as Miss Fantasia Fair that sane year. In 1978 Lind received a Service Avard froa the Outreach institute.
Lind's popularity in the crossdressing conaunity is universal and her name is known to crossdressers transsexuals, their fanilies, and to helping professionals She enjoys a reputation of caring and concern for her sisters that is seldon atched.
asked prior to receiving the honor what nessage she aight convey to the gender conaunity folloving nearly fifty years of crossdressing, Lind replied, "Strength through unity. All groups, no atter vat their arientation, should vork together for the connon good. Ve are either going to survive together, or ve vill each hang separately.

In addition to the prince avard, the annual Trinity Avards, recognizing extraordinary contributions and acconplishaents in the gender connunity, were avarded at the IFGE "Coning Together - Working Together" convention. Honorees vere Ellen Sunnerg (in recognition of her years of caring, selfless service to others, as vell as hep kindness); Sheila kirk (leader, teacher, and Priend); Yvonne Cook (an extraordinary exanple of love, courage and self-sacrifice); Boulton a Park Society (sponsorship of the Texas "T" Party in a ailitantly conservative environaent); stanley Biber, M.D. (an outstanding nedical caretaker and extraordinary hunan being); and Mariefte Pathy Allen (a true friend and supporter of the gender comunity)

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## hormone treatments oenied TO TS INMATE IN CALIFORNIA

(Sacranento, CA) -- A federal nagistrate has refused to order officials at the California Medical Facility at vacaville to provide fenale hormone treatments for a transsexual innate, but has instead instructed then to conduct a thorough nedical and psychiatric reviev of the inuate and reconiend treatuent
19-year-old Georgette Rebecca belcher, who is serving a life teri for kidnapping and robbery, clains depression and anxiety attacks because prison officials have refused to continue the hormone treatients she had received for several years before being incarcerated in 1989. U.S. Magistrate John Moulds chastised the California Departaent of Coprections for not having a fornal policy on the providing of therapy to transsexual innates.
A physician for the department testified he is reluctant to prescribe fenale horiones for male patients because they could cause severe health problens. Ar thup Mattocks, a clinical psychologist at vacaville, said there vas no reason to believe that be leher vould suffer ir eversible psychological danage fron the loss of fenale appearance because of the discontinuance of hormone treatient
Hattocks said sone nale fnates at the facility had received fenale hormones a fey years ago, but that he vas unavare of any currently receiving that treatment. Before being incarcerated, Belcher had breast ipplants, but not a sex thange operation.

## NEU 900-NUMBER RESOURCE acless service goEs on-line

(Atlanta, 6A) -- A ney autonated telephone service has gone on line to serve the national crossdressing conaunity by providing resources to those who cannot othervise learn of thes.
"Hin 2 Fen Guide", operated by Audiotextures, incorporates inforation regarding organizations and publications, a calendar of scheduled events and a shopping guide to help crossdressers purchase clothing and services. According to editor Jerpie Atking, the service thope(s) to provide reassurance and dininish feelings for loneliness, guilt and dissinilarity for those atose fanily, business and social obligations are frightening and suffocating to their fea degipes
By refusing to accept sexually explicit aterials for the service, the ney service hopes to reach those who cannot or vill not subscribe to crossdresser publications or join crossdresser organizations. Atkins further hopes that by using the audiotext qualities of anonynity and ubiquity, callers vill feel secure in calling and vill eventually feel part of the national gender conounity.
The service is accessible at $1-900-146-2336$ for $\$ 1.07$ per ninute plus 82.00 connection fee. Inforation for the service is being provided by the participating groups and sepvices.

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## OOLTER RELASES RESULTS OF GENDER IDENTITY SURUEY

(Northridge, CA) -a potential measure of transgendered behavior vas introduced by Richard F. Docter, Ph.D. in the pirst "feedback repert' on his recent research.
A "Cross Gender Ident:by" (Cal) score has been developed by Docter, conbining survey results in the areas of feninime gender identity, nascuiline gender identity, feninine role iaking, and desire for body reninization. A high cel score tends to occur with transsexuals and transgenderists, according to Docter, because of indications of strong teainine identaty, social behavior, and desire for physical change to accentuate fenininity.
Docter has set a nedian score of 100 on the C6! scales and on the sub-scales that deteraine a Cal score. He says that roughly $66 x$ of his survey group fall betveen 85 and 115 . The survey group consisted of 332 genetic nales nade up aainly of periodic crossdressers. of that group, lix described thenselves as living full-tine as women either vith or without sexual reassignaent surgery, and lox considered thenselves to be pre-operative transsexuals even though they vere not living full-tine.

Docter stressed that his vork is on-going in nature, and that he is developing a second gender identity questionnaire for future conpletion by the survey group.

## TS UINS EARLY PENSION POST-SURGERY

(Brisbane, Australia) -- In a landarark decision, the Australian Adainistrative Appeals Tribunal has found that a 61 -year-old voman who had had a sex change operation is entitied to receive an age pension, even though aen are not eligible until they turn 65 .
The aajority decision said that the lav had to acknowledge that Australian society peraitted sexual reassigneent surgery to take place, and thus the roann, identified only as A.H., vas eligible for the pension at age 60 , just as other vonen are.
The tribunal heard an appesal by Secretary of the Department of Social Secwity Cerek Volker against a decision by the Social Security Appeals Tribunal in February of last year. That tribunal had upheld H.H.'s appeal against a rejection of her apolication for an age pension because the accoapanying birth certificate sald she vas a nale. The Adainistrative Appeals Tpibunal found it "extraordinary" that counsel for Volker had stated the department had no official policy on the atter and invited the tribunal to develop a policy. In response, the tribunal stated that '(t)he tive has come to arrive at soce standard by wich to test a person's sexi.
H. H., who had lived as a woala for nany years, was treated by her local conaunity as such, and carpied a queensland driver's license describing hep sex as fewale. In fact, the decision said, until she coplied for the age pension one month before her 60 in birthday in 198, she vas treated by the Department of Social Security as a volan.
The decision stated that only transsexuals who had undergone sexual reassigneent surgery should be classified as waien for purposes of the Social Security Act. A spokesvonan for the Depar taent said $H$. H's pension rould be backdated to when she lodged hep original aggeal vith the Social Security Appeals Tribunal. Espyney horning Herald'd

(Fort Pierce, FL) -- A tall, skinny black aan in a green floral deess is believed to have stolen sone clothes fron a Sabal Pali Plaza shop, leavine lehind eight lipstick-covered alary censors that he apparenity bit off, the anager said

The incident is just one in a resent rash of aen in dresses ripping off businesses in st, Lucie and hartin counties
Police say the crossdressing shoplifters ay have their origins in a two-year-old $\forall$ Vesi pali transvestite burglary ring. Seven men linked to that sace group vere arresied here two and three years ago.
Several suspicious sightings of nen dressed as vosen have been reported to local authorities lately, vith sone of the conplaints coning fron security guards at Orange Blosson mall and at clothing stores elseuhere

Last month, a pori St. Lucie paun shop ouner told sheriff's deputies he sav a tall, skinny black oan vith a five $o^{\prime}$ clock shadov slipping some thing under his pink-and-blue floral dress. Men in dresses are believed to be responsible for three shoplifting cases in the Jensen Beach Treasure Coast Square hall -- two at JCPenney and one at Sears -- officials say.
In the latest incident at the kick in the Pants clothing store, the sane transvestite seen in the store on Friday is believed to have stolen at least four pairs of shorts and jeans, the store manager said.

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# SEX, GENDER AND TERMINOLDGY

Not long ago, I vas taking vith Virginia Prince about her favorite subject, sex and gender. And something she said in the course of that conversation cross-referenced in my head to ay favorite subject, tens withan the gentar community
What Virginla satd -- paraphrasing here -- vas that transsexualisa is the only condition within our commanity that deals with sexual identity rather than gender identity. On that Jasis, the term transgenderist is every bit as valid as transsexual, to some degree
What that also means to ue is that the scale on which ve have been eeasuring "transgendered behavior" is actually two scales: One ueasuring transvestic (or transgender) bethavior (with transvestite at one end and transgenderist at the other), and the other measuring transsexual behavior (beginning at some point on the transgender scale and continuing to an end point of post-operative transsexual)
If you look at it that vay, a lot of things becone clearer. Such as the TV who eventually decides he's TS. He gets to that point on the TG scale whepe the TS scale begins and changes direction. Others tho get to that point on the if scale, question whether or not they are TS, but do not change direction.
In my case, this relationship between the two scales, sex and gender, akes clearer my journey through the gender comunity. I started on the To scale, got to the point where the TS scale begins, changed scales, and then eventually reached a point where I didn't feel' justified in proceeding further along that scale. So l vent back to the intersection and reapproached the conaunity fron the TG scale. This especially akes sense when you consider that viptually all transsexuals begin their journey through crossdressing.
Earlier, I said this approach legitiaizes the tera transgenderist to some degree. The probles is, this argunent still applies the terus to their entire scales, and there not only needs to be a tera for someone who lives full-time, at the other end of the if scale iron transvestite, but there probably should be a teri for someone at the junction point, at the other and of the TS scale froe post-op pranssexual
I do think, though, that ve can stapt looking at the tepa - gender conaunity as ueaning all aeabers of both scales. We noy need to agree that there are two saller conaunities vithin that larger one; the transgendered conaunity and the transsexual community.... both of whom have different perspectives, both valid vithin the scope of the lapger connunity. On that basis, "Cross-Talk" is geaped tovard the transgendered conmunity, because even when ve discuss is issues, ve look at thea fron the TVITG pepspective. I'a fairly certain that this line of thinking is unlikely to offend either of the two comeunities as it pespects the differences in vieypoints.

To vany, it seens that i keep asking these questions about language without coning up with the definitive answers. That's because I don't feel it would be appropriate to single-handedly dictate a list of "acceptable" teras. But it's just as obvious that the longer ve go on using different teras to say the same things, the longer it vill take for society to know the differences betveen the vapious conditions that aake up the gender connunity, and thus the longer it will take for society to understand us.
lbelieve it is time for all the leaders in oup comanity to exchange ideas on the subject of language, and to peach a consensus on what any of us vill wean when we use a particular tera. Until ve have clear, universal definitions of the teras and behaviors that make up our commaity in use by the aid-point of this decade, ve vill never be able to completely eliminate mainstrean public confusion
And that's just going to prolong the agony ve all feel because of public unacceptance of our lifestyle.

Other cultures have created a place for such as us, giving us a role. Dur technological society has given us a technological answer. Rather than putting a square peg in a square whole, eedicine/psychiatry/society puts us on a lathe and turns us into a round peg and lits us into a hole it recognizes. In other vords, rather than expanding its human horizons our culture would rather expand its technological hopizons and change that which does not ift its template into sone thing that does

Better to change/blane the individual than recognize/adait fault on society's part.

Perhaps ve should be defining new roles. Let us not forget that prior to the latter half of this century SRS didn't exist and thepefore was not an option. How then did -- using cuprent idion -- transsexuals of the EC [Before Chpistine] era rope? Hoy did they find a way to fit in? Now, l's not saying, "Let's go back to the bad old days. I al saying, what vere sone of the nethods the vere used to deal vith' these issues and hoy can we adapt thei and introduce then to our technoculture? Ve see that other cultures aanaged the TG issue successfully, but their solutions can't be transplanted directly into ours. A cardiac surgeon aust not only carefully uateh a.donor heart vith a hearit transplant patient but that heart and patient aust be treated cheaicals to reduce the possibility of rejection.
As auch as we are porced to live outside our society, to the point of creating our oun subculture (l hate the teri paraculture), we are still products of it. As meabers of the industrialized First Vorld test we have a eechanistic aind set, though many of us try to unleapn it, that aind set deteraines not only the kinds of solutions ve find, but deteraines the kinds of problens ve define. Deteraines the questions we ask.
A fev coluans ago the issue vas teras. Transvitate. Contragender. He are talking about something very siailar to the Berdache (as I understand it), but not guite the same gince, at the very least, ve are talking about two very different cultures.
Another question occurs to me now, or perhaps a glimpse of the future. Hov are ve changing society by introducing the concept of the Transvitate? Are we teaching it that nothing is black and white? Are we teaching it that there are nore than just the engineers' viey of the universe? It is not a new concept, just a foreign one. Vell, this is just an aside.

We are products of our society, and at the sane tive society is a product of its meebers. As long as ve renain in the closet ve have effect on society and the status renains quo. As we blosson in viey of society, we affect it and our presence changes it. As the flover goes to seed and the seed drops to the ground and gerainates those changes take root We then becone papt of a sociological ecosystae. Ve feed and are in turn fed. The tiae to plant is now.

To me it seems that only a person ectpoiled in a thin canopy of self-delusion, nervous of any true expansion or change, vould challenge altermatives as soon as they shov thenselves, despite having acknovledged the need for then. Pephaps ve need to fora a comaittee to discuss teras. You knov nothings ever really impossible until given to a comittes!
Fear of change is vaunted to be a very nale habit, so pepchance there is still sone pole of aasculinity inside our very "fenale" aenbers. Or perhaps it's just as a GT vould see it: a part of a being a conplete human being (or total androgyne) in which one voice illuainates the next and one gender touches the other. Obviously, an unbrella tera aust encompass all others. I vould never suggest the expulsion of other teras under an uabrella... since TV and TS have for so long been the only unbrella, have other teras been expelled by that unbrelle?
Ulitiately, free choice nakes the change. If sufficient people elech, fron constious personal decision, to be called one or the other, that is how it should be. But hoy, for example, do TSs fit in with shifting acruss gender lines? Not very vell, apparently, sa their problees, needs for every more secure, closed and closeted groups, and endless paranoia vould suggest. Even as they make the bpave stand to change their oun lives for theaselves, they appear to pun avay fron true persona! choice. Many acadeaics think that if wales vere free to be "gender benders" or TVs and not so condeaned by aen for theip actions or voeen por invading "their" space, that TSs vould cease to exist (or at least becone fever), and surgery vould seldon prove to be the only solution. Aftep all, as Anne Blackvood points out in hep january coluan (which is what got te started on this dissertation), Kyaberleigh seens to manage vithout surgery, and 50 too do !
But then, swapping one half-life for another is not really the answer (except in atoolc physics). A nodern wonan can be a tomboy or pover dresser ... or bicbo, housewife, anything he/she likes. So, too, can a TS. My friend Clape steen (who I shall introduce to you nope fully in a future coluan), as a self-described GT/TS, has a dipty job in a factory, where she vears blue jeans because of the vork. Yet hep nale doctor and the rainland TS group contend that she should vear a skipt, even though a fenale in the same position vill opt for the same jeans clape vears.
Clare calls herself a "TS vonan", not vanting to use the second tera without the first, because she is sufficiently confident of the level of hep feaininity of aind and attitude to eabrace what's left of her aasculinity and an advantage and option to be used and applied to hep total life. She can do what's nale in her oun sueet, feainine vay Besides, she looks good in jeans!
l, too, knoy what a as. A true androgyne, fap from feaping finding out. It is ae and others like ayself that are

Using the guns of the governaent to "aake" a business deal with us on our oun teras could be as much a dangerous
precedent as a "landmark". The more we use the courts to
Porce others to accept us, the less free everyone -including ourselves -- becones. Furthernore, knowing the tendency of sone eleanents in the Comanity to push the liaits of good taste (you know EXCEED is wat i really nean), the nost certain abuse of any nev-found rights is sore likely to stir up resentment against us, rather than pronote our acceptance.
The key issue here, as i see it, is the right of a business ouner to establish the conditions under which he (or she) will offer sepvice to the public. i know that the notion of a dress code, for example, is obnoxious to nost of us, especially when it is applied as a double standard betveen the ladies and the gentleaen (what restaurant has EYER required neckties on the ladies?). Never the less, if a business ouner decides that he vants to operate his establishment for the benefit of those who prefer such an environment, he has a noral right to do so. Our reaedy is to take our business elsewhere
i realize that the courts have, of late, decided that they can linit a business ouner's options -- this does not mean that they did so in JUSTICE

Fupthermore, the more ve encourage the courts to take this sort of action, the nope likely it is that, one day, that pover vill be used against us, perhaps not as a Comaunity, but as individuals pursuing other interests.

UE Know that nost of us are fanily people who, in fact, do fit the sort of inage that Disneyland vants to sepve. i vould urge a letter-uriting ranpaign to educate the a anagenent at Disney. Suggestions aight include the creation of a fey single-user hisoor-hess aptional restroons so that the gender conflicted can use then without the fenales in attendance feeling that their security is being conpronised. If ve get the vord spread nationvide, l believe that even the oisney managenent will see an econonic advantage in some kind of acconnodation
lt is ay hope that in upiting, ve vill conduct ourselves as ladies, just as we vould if we were visiting the park. The best veapon ve have toyard changing public perceptions of our Connunity is a consistent ladylike demeanop under all circunstances.

What do I aean by "ladylike"? A lady is neither loud nor abrasive -- rather, she is fira, persistent, and cala.
expanding our boundaries beyond petty borders. To those like Anne Blackvood who clain that TSs have a 'pretty good sense of gendep and sexa, I vonder about the reams of paper, aagazines, letters, etc., both inside our comanity and out, in the media and acadeaic circles, that cannot, vill not, and has not concluded or concured on just what a is is.
No, within our aicrocosa of the adinstrea, there is a little toy vacuun of delusions, holding onto all the faults of mainstrean society as playthings.

Infinite options doesn't mean a lack of discipline; to the contrary, rather, if one has that many options some will be bad, yrong either for the person or society, therefore one has a strong, if simple, discipline and code of behavior to follow. Meedless aspects of guilt and concern can be trianed avay, but the actual use of such guides to choice should be positive and applied through one's ability to adapt and adopt.

Recently, l've had occasion to discuss dersonal levels of transgendered behavior vith quite a few folks. A lot of it was for ny own benefit to see if there vas anyone else out there who had found a transgendered "confort level" akin to the one I had finally settied on. Surprise! There vere a lot nore than I thought!
Because !'a going to discuss this from a personal aspect, I've couched it in M2F teris; however, the sane concepts also apply F2h.
l've noticed a nunber of us who self-classify as transgenderist (TG) -- op naybe there is such a classification as a non-SRS \$S. We're yery fenale oriented, but don't see a need at this point to conplete SRS. Hy personal philosophy is that SRS is only necessary if (1) you wish to be sexually active vith straight ales or (2) you oust align your body so that your ghysicaliy atch your self-inage in all fenale aspects. at this point, l've found I can live in hareony vith nyself vith just secondary fenale characteristics. This, then, Bandates a therapy that is not officially sanctioned by the $U . S$. redical conaunity -hor wone therapy alone. Thus I've been forced to go outside the nedical connunity 'standard' for treatment to ay personal satisfaction. The hormones not only are allowing ie to achieve an acceptable body inage, but geen to have a calning effect with ne, so l' nuth nope relaxed and in a nore desirable nental state. Regardless of whether the effect is a direct result of the hormones or psychosonatic, the effect is positive.
The problen ? have with current redical thinking in the U.S. is the failure to recognize the validity of a transgendered behavior where SRS is not indicated yet varrants hor none therapy. Dr. Richard Docter probably cones closest to recognizing this in his book, but it still falls slightly short of the nark, Sadly, ibelieve, a lot of folks go through the expense and pain of SRS when just hornone therapy alone vould have been satisfactory. But the vay the medical comunity has set it up/dictated to us, you can't get hormones under the HBISC unless you're diagnosed as a good candida te for SRS. Basicaliy, the nedical comanity is still on the back side of the learning curve when it cones to conpletely understanding all facets of transgendered behavior and the aultiplicity of possible therapies. So, it seens that stodgy old coots are best by lack of inaginative thinking -- you're either all nale or all feale in physical appearance; there is no such thing as a vell-adjusted person who is a conbination of both physically
l've alvays advocated finding a level of transgendered behavior that fits vithin the context of the rest of your life and where you can life that life in hareony. I think sone people let transgendered behavior rule their lives rather than naking it just a positive aspect of the vhole person. Sone of this nay be attributable to the nedical connunity, where sone people eust got to a level of therapy beyond that which nay be suffictenk. In other vords, they are driven into an igeroper niche and thus are not in conplete harmony wit the rest of their life expectations
Despite having focused this editorial largely at one area of transgendered behavior, I believe it also serves to eaphasize the iaportance of each transgendered person having the freedon to find their oun personal niche on the transgendered behavior scale. li your transgendered behavior is not in balance vith the rest of your life, then there's something vrong. It also points to the value of using other people as a "sounding board" in order to arrive in your "confort zone".
! know this is a potentially controversial topic, but it's a subject that nust be broached on the vay to a coaplete understanding of transgendered behavior. A person part iale and part fenale physically can indeed be a viable alternative.

Dear Susan: You sure saund confused about eyeshadow! It's not as difficult as it may seen. There are a fey general pules, but to be nore specific, a trip to a professional cosmetologist would be the most beneficial. First, lighter colors look better right under the eyebrow arch and in the middle of the eyelid. Darker colors are better placed in the crease, extending up anf blending tovard the end of the eyebrown. The most flattering dark colors are purple, burgundy, autunn green and brown. Blue eyes can vear deep blue or turqouise in the crease or smudged over the lover lash eyeliner, but don't overdo it and don't vear it on the lid. Blue shador does tend to wash out the color of blue eyes, so if you ust wear it, be sure the shade contrasts with your eyes. Brown eyes can vear blue on the did, but again, don't overdo it. Three different colors of shador are usually the maximum, and sticking with natural earth tones is your best bet

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# USING TELEVISION AS A TOOL

Much has been said and veititep about hov ve can develop a fashion sense by observing the genetic fenales around us.
Indeed, for the part-tine crosseresser, having an everyday male appearance makes it natural to gipl-vatch; to the casual observer, unavare of your notivations, nothing unusual is taking place. Even for the transgenderist or transsexual, there is nothing overtly unusual for one voean to scrutinize another's appearance; vonen are alvays checking each other's hair, makeup, and outfits. But for those vio feel even a little uneasy about girl vatching for this reason, the solution is close at hand.

Many havé used mail-order catalogs, such as Lane Bryant or Avon Fashions, to get a sense of what colors and styles vork well together. Unfortunately, these catalogs do not cone out frequently enough to allow a continuous upiating of your criteria. Fortunately, cable television has come to the rescue.

Virtually every cable systen has expanded to the point where hone-shopping channels occupy at least one channel The nost populap are Home Shopping Club (HSC) and Quality Value Convenience (GUC) Metvopk. Onfortunately the network that used to be the sost useful, the JCPenney felevision Shopping Channel, recently vent of f the air. JCPenney used to devote the rast aajority of its progranaing tovard vomen's fashions, but both HSC and QVC still provide a significant anount. The advantage or the transgendered individual is that the parade of fashions is ever-changing and they are nodeled on-canera by live nodels, which is a distinct inprovenent over looking at a photo in a catalog. Plus you get to see all sides of an out\}it, not just whatever angle the catalog photographer thought best! Uhile homeshopping channels are a convenient, secure vay to shop, with only a fey drawbacks, I vould first like to discuss hov sustained vieving of these cable services can iaprove your fashion sense.

Remenber that not every style hooks good on everyone. If you have deterajned that colors sonk good on you (see the past two nonths' coluans), then you vill be able, when an outfit in your colors appears on sereen, to better estinate hov it wight look on you. After a vile you vill begin to nore quickly recognize the styles that it your inage. A good rule of thunb is that if you don't find the nodel's appearance on-canera attractive, odds are that the outfit she's vearing von't look good on you, either

As for the convenience of shopping by cable, all of these networks have a policy of "one ordering name to a
household". This means that whoever orsers something from then, they vill alvays use the sane name that their computer has on file for that address as the "menter". How this works in your favor is that even if a wife or daughter places an order, if the husband's name is on file, that's the name they'll nail under. Obviously, no one there is going to find it odd that "John Jones" is being shipped a size 18 dress ey'll all presume it's for John's vife and that has nane is the one the conputer has on file for their hone. And there certainly isn't anything "suspicious" about UPS delivering a package fron a home-shopping netvork! Best of all, at least one (HSC) has an autonated ordering systen using your touch-tone phone, so once you've placed your firsf order (which could be for a set of tools, or a sall appliance, or whatever) with an operator, your account is established vith the computer and subsequent orders von't even require you to say another vord to a live operator

Even if you never order from these channels, though, you can use then to develop your fashion sense, if you just vatch the with the right attitude.

There was a time, not 50 long ago when nost ansvers could be found within the pages of the sible. The twentieth century, hovever, has given birth to forces which have had a dranatic affect on al! those truths that ve regarded yesterday as self-evident certainties. Change is everywhere, and as bishop John Sheiby Spong has pointed out "tblefore our nornal life expectancy is concluded, the rate and rapidity of change vill nake our day look as if it had been captured by a slov-notion canera:
Christian response to the nev insights and realities of our vorld has of ten been condeanation. Galileo and Copernicus vere exconaunicated, vaccinations and left-handed people vere condeaned for being Satanic, and anything challenging the authority of the church is condeaned as heresy.
The vorld of Jesus' day has changed, and the vorld continues to change vithin this whirluind of change, ve aust live and vorship and vitness
In bits and pieces that are of ten the subject of lively debate, twentieth century science has been teaching us rore about the fine points of how ve -- wen and vonen -- differ Ve are learning nore about our physiology, our psychology, and hov social interplay betveen the two influences both. For each question ansvered, hovever, a dozen nore renain to be ansvered. Questions about the ethics of sex reassignaent produce even uore lively debate; coning doun in the end to the conservative viev that sex reassignaent is inherently vrong or to the liberal viey that it is the right thing to do in properly selected cases.
Moral inplications of sex reassignaent surgery vere evaluated by Catholic theologians at the pope John Center in St. Louis in 1983. They conceded that "[i]t it vere possible for a person objectively to be of one gender while at the same tine of the opposite anatonical and physiological sex, then in such a situation nornonal and surgical alterations could be seen as corrective rather than being an unjustifiable type of autilation in the theological sense." Their conclusion, hovever, was that '... no clear and definitive noral decision in favor of transsexual surgery can be aade because of lack of convincing proof that sucti disharnony does objectively exist and that transsexual surgery could be justified as corrective and therapeutic."
on the other hand their position was found to be curiously anbivalent by Jesuit priest R. H. Springer Springer pointed out that the catholic theologians acknowledged that "fbjoth the transsexual and the therapist aay vell be convinced that the surgery vould be genuinely therapeutic and ethically acceptable, and that Sone pastoral counselors a nay yell alake soae judqeaent (t.e. that surgery is noraliy justified)." While continuing to hold their position that sex reassigneent surgery was "unjustifiable autilation, " hovever, they vent on to reconnend that "one should mevep consider transsexual surgery until all other treatment possibilities have been explored. "This reconnendation is one that cannot be overstressed.
Moral theologians look to the Bible for their ansvers. As a source of noral values, it needs no apology. "Of all the literature that has cone to us fron the vorla's ancient civilizations, none is more fascinating -- or as provocative -- as the Hebrew Bible. It is highly esteened by three of the world's great religions -- Islan, Judaisn, and Christianity -- and yei to aany people it seens perplexing to read, and difficult to understand. is it possible to aake sense of its contents in a vay that says sonething to people living at the end of the tuentieth century? As one night expect, the Bible contains no direct refefences to gender identity confusion or prenatal sex deteraination. So where can ve look for ansvers?
The controversy surrounding sex. reassignaent surgery has
raged for over thirty years. The cause(s) of transsexualisa are disputed anong professionals; uost of the controversy locusing on vether the ettology is psychogenic or organic Lacking objective evidence, noral theologians have thus concluded that sex reassignaent surgery as a treatuent nodality is suspect and "unjustified whtilation."
The debate has led any Christians to becone rery rocal and insistent about the innorality of sex reassignuent, rejecting sex reassignment surgery as aintrinsically outside the linits of ethical medicine." (Ashley and o'rourke), or as an abonination of God. These sane people often go on to use Scripture as a club to inflict guill on the transsexual. As a result, many transsexuals live in agony sincerely trying to reconcile their connitnent to god in Christ to their "uninvited dilenma."
god has shown by his actions and nature that his love and concern extend to every area of hunan life. At, the heart of the book of Deuteronony is the instruction to "Love the Lord your god vith all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength ${ }^{\boldsymbol{p}^{\prime}}$ (Deuteronony 6 : 5 ). Likevise, Love for neighbors is also advocated -- "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against one of your people, but love your neighbor as yourself" "Leviticus [9:18]. Jesus stresses the inportance of these two connandents by repeating then in the Gospel of Matther $22: 34-10-1$ e., 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and vith all your aind. This is the first and greatest connandment. And the second is like it: Love your neightor as yourself. All the Lav and the Prophets hang on these two cunnanduents."
In other vords, our love of god aust issue in love top men. Willian Barclay calls our attention to the order of the comandments, hovever; "[i]t is love of God first, and love of aan second. It is only when ve love god that nan becones lovable. The Biblical teaching about ann is not that aan is a collection of chenical elenents, not that aan is part of the brute creation, but that aan is lade in the inage of bod iGenesis $1: 26-27$. It is for that reason that ian is lovable. The true basis of all denocracy is in fact that love of God. Take avay the love of God and ve can becone angry at aan the unteachable; ve can becone pessinistic about nan the unjuprovable ve can becone callous to nan the nachine-ninder. The love of an is firaly grounded in the love of God."
Barclay's' connentary is carried a step further by the late Alan Paton -- i.e., "!saiah $1: 10-18$ and Mat ther $25: 31-40$ nake it clearer to us what 6od's cause is. It clearly has sonething to do with caring for otherg. If ve do not care for or about others, then no anount of churchgoing, no nunber of observances, no anount of money given, no anount of believing, will give us any cause worth working for. in fact, one cannot believe in god in a religious sense unless one has this concern for others. To love aeans to bring one's whole life under discipline, extrene in the case of Francis, 'wholesoee' in the case of cost others. This discipline, even if not extrene, ceans, negatively, refraining fron any unloving or aean or cruel act, and positively, the offering of oneself to be aade an instrunent of God's peace. Clearly, our greatest offenses are to be unloving and uncaring.
The Bible, as ve've seen, is very clear about our responsibilities and relatlonship to God and our neighbors, but does it say anything about sex reassignaent?

## POLITICAL ACTIVISH: A TREND?

Political Action Conaittees -- we have all heard of then, usually in connection with isbbying Congress for sone special interest group. Closer to hone, the gay and lesbian comanity used this concept to begin the slou process of changing the public's abtitude tovard then. This oovetent is now energing in a a part of the transgender comunity

While at the 1991 ! $F 6 E$ convention in Denver, ! had several opportunities to talk vith Cynthia Hovard of the Gender Alternatives League. Her goal is to renove the stigna from gender-associated behaviors that do not fit the cultural nora. While her current focus is on the renoval of transgender behaviors fros the DSH categories, I suspect that her goals are much broader

I also had the opportunity to talk vith any other meabers of the transgender conaunity in a variety of settings. The resulting view, for me, is that the community is groving and changing. Not only have sone differences within the conaunity been resolved, there is also some evidence that ve are becoaing nore active in educating the comunity about transgender behaviors.

There has been a rapid grouth in both the number and strength of organizations that support the people of the connunity. In some vays this change parallels the changes that took place in the gay and lesbian connunity sone is years ago. Are you on the sane track? In aany ways the siailarities betveen the transgender and gay conaunities are quite striking, especially so vhen one focuses on the crossdresser. Neither are visible unless they choose to reveal thenselves. Thile some vould say that you can spot (identify) a gay person by their looks, that is not true. Further, both the gay and the crossdresser (had) have a lot to lose by "going public". In fact, despite progress, this is still true for the gay. Just vitness the phenomenon called "outing" where someone who is in the closet is identified as gay by someone who is out of the closet. While public acceptance of gays and lesbians have iaproved, there are still many bigots and "gay bashers" left.

The question is vhether the gains to be made by beconing sore visible outveigh the very real potential for loss. I suspect the jury is still out for the gay comaunity. Hovever, the transgende? conaunity has benefited froe the gay conaunity's efforts to gain public acceptance. I suspect the tine is soon coning when ve vill see some movenent in the transgender comanity to build on this foundation.

Hovever, before you nove in that direction, it is necessary to carefully formulate just what it is that you vant the public to accept. What the gays asked for vas simply respect and tolerance. They did not vant to display their behavior. Will such be possible for the transgender comunity, especially if one aspect of the desired acceptance is public consent to crossdressed ales?

## SPLIT PERSONALITIES

It has always strikes ue as odd when one of ay sisters makes a big deal of the different lives and personalities residing in Jane/John. You all know the story of John who works as a high povered executive, hiring, firing, ootivating, fighting the corporate battles and suashing the opposition who comes home at night, puts on a slip and lace and becomes Jane who has no responsibilities, sits there passively and accepts direction from the wife or girlfriend. Or maybe john is a construction worker with macho auscles who calls crude suggestions to passing women and Jane gets odd looks in a nicro mini in the shopping mall.
Once again I exaggerate, I know there are many shades and gradations as there are crossdressers. So why does this split personality transvestite have two such divergent personalities living in one body? ! can't think that Jane would be happy in John's place, or vice versa.

How has John become entrapped in a career that requires hi to hide Jane? He thinks he knows what would happen if he let fane take over. The corporate sharks would gather and attack his "reakness". His subordinates would not pay attention to a polite request, his boss vould vonder if he has the "right stuff" to be a high povered executive Conversely, Jane vould not be able to be the vonderful fiction that she is if she had to think for herself, or take any action. Somehor it seens that the situation is out of hand, but all those decisions made in the past have led inevitably to the way things are today. Any change could lead to ruin, but neither John, Jane or the people associated with them are happy about the situation.

What we have here is a variation of the pover and control cycle found in fanily abuse. If you haven' $t$ heard of it, it's not surprising, our society does its best to hide abusive relationships under the cover of the loving fanily pattern familiar to sitcon vievers. I an a trained rape and abuse counselor, and have been struck by the similarities between the two situations. For those of us aen who aspire to the feninine, understanding this destructive cycle is essential

An abusive pelationship begins vith distorted ideas of gender. The nale partner usually thinks he must be supreme and in control, the fenale falls into the subuissive and weak category, often to the point where she is unable to break out of the role and get out of a destructive, violent relationship And yes l'a afraid it is virtually always the male controliing the female. While there are exceptions, they are extrenely few. The male can use many techniques to enforce these roles, enotional abuse, financial and physical isolation, intimidation, threats to children and family nembers and sexual abuse of the famale partner

The classic cycle of violence begins with everything rosy, life is beautiful and the future is bright But sooner or later something happens and he starts to find fault, he becones abusive. She ralks on eggs, never knowing what will set hil off. The tension builds and physical abuse starts, gets worse; she hides the bruises, after all it's her fautt that he hit her, she didn't do the right things for his, pight? One day it all blows up and she really gets it, maybe lands in the hospital. The tension is broken, he is sontrite, brings her presents and promises never to let this happen again, she believes his and everything is rosy. Then the tension builds
l'll leave the comparisons with the guilt cycle of the transvestite as an exercise for the student. Gid you know that, on average, a vonan will return to $3 n$ abusive relationship eight times, knowing that she will be beaten again? Why vould any oerson in their right aindgo back to be beaten eight times before getting out? The answer is as conplex as the personalities involved. She probably has no way to earn a living by herself, or to support the children Neither she nor her husband wants to admit that something is wrong to the world at large Strange as it may seem, they are probably in love with each other, and need each other
 bache!or girl got so sick of being hassled and hustled by aklrt-chasing eeseps that she donned a austache and nacho clothes -- and spent six wonths nasquerading as a man!
"I always figured things yere a lot easier for the fellows and by God, I was right, 28 -year-old Andrea Elkins said. The sexy secretary decided to try life as a quy to escape a barrage of bavdy proposals, winks and volf wistles she faced daily on the streets of New York City. Says Elkins, "I couldn't walk five blocks without having a bunch of hardhats houting and hollering at ne ... the wost disgusting men think nothing of rubbing up against you or pinching your butt."
She asked her lavyer boss if she could show up for work disquised as a an for a day or two saying she vanted a break fron "all that sexist crap". She was so tickled with her life as a man that she didn't remove the disquise until her boss finally laid down the lav a fer months later: "He said he vas tired of giving dictation to a lady with a \#ustache."

No, the TV has to find a way to let those two personalities coexist in harnony. It's not easy. The split personality transvestite is in as much of a bind as the wonan trapped in an abusive relationship. obviously, the ansver is to allow the ale and fenale sides to uerge, but what about fanily, job, finances, and all the ayriad aspects that will be affected. About the only thing ! can say is that left unresolved the cycle of violence vithin a person vill destroy that person and those they love.
haybe John will have to walk out on his job and take the econonic, social and personal risks of a nev career rore in line with the needs of his/her blended personality. Haybe jane vill have to begin to live more in reality than in frothy fantasyland of fenininity she now inhabits. If it's really bad, counseling nay be needed, or naybe just sone advice frou a trusted sister or friend.
By the way, if you are interested in aore information about rape/abuse and its causes, contact your local rape/abuse hotline, it should be in the phone book. You night even consider taking the training to becone a counselor. As a transvestite you have a unique perspective that will prove valuable, and what you learn vill help you understand your own life. Try it, it could be very rewarding both for you and soneone who needs the help.

## CUSTOM PRESS-ON NAILS

by Divinity
In ay earliest efforts of taninize ay appearance, $l$ had used several sets of the press-on cheapo nail kits available fron the grocery and drug stores They just did not do the job. First of all, they didn': fit ay hands at all. Hy thunbs, especially, are very vice and flat. Plus, as a result of attenpting to stop numerous car doors fron closing all the way, my thumbnails nore resenble a yashboard than a nail belonging to anyone (other than a Klingon)
I had reached the point where I vas just about to give up on longer nails, and simply polish ay natural nails and let it go at that, even if that didn't give ae the aost feninine apgearance
then, one day when I was taking ay vig in for a shanpoo and style, I noticed all the nail ladies hard at vork "Aha!", ! thought. "Maybe they could advise ne on hor to resolve this nagging problen.' As it developed, one of then did come up vith a solution.
So one Saturday morning at $7: 15$ (before all the other nail stylists and custoners invaded ay privacy), ve nade a set of acrylic nails for ae. The secret difference is that ay stylists did NOT prepare ay nails for peraanent bonding. When a vonan goes in for acrylics, the stylist roughs up the surface of the natural nails and cleans then vith a harsh astringent. Only then does the acrylic conpound go on, and once dry it takes a jackhanner to get then off!
with uine, hovever, the acrylic conpound vas applied directly onto oy "dirty", unroughened nails. This, I vas advised, vould perait we to "pop" the nails off at the end of the evening. So, after leaving the salon shortly before 9:00, , spent an entire day vearing ay ney longep, beautiful and VERY purple nails. The looks ! got! After telling clerks at the grocery store, the optonetrist, Builders Enpopiun and the dry cleaners that I yas going to be in a glay that evening (ha!), I tired of the charade and just let people think whatever they vantad.
I discovered that putting on aakeup that evening vas nore difficult vith the nails than! had considered, and I took a lot longer to get out of the house (let alone the closet). But I succeeded in puncing zas, visiting the ATh and spending a pleasant evening at the queen mary vithout a single problen. And the acpylics did, in fact, cone right off.
vell ... not RIGHT off. A couple did pop off easily, but the others required the use of a pair of fueezers to pry under the edge of the acrylics to get then started. But there vas no trouble, no pain, no iess, no need to renove the nail color, no reason to lose the acrylics. If you go this route and find you need to use tweezers for renoval, ! suggest you spread the treezers far enough apart that you avoid scratehing the surface of the nails.
Needless to say, I vas pleasantly, surprised, relieved, happy and satisfied. Now, whenaver 1 wap one of ay purple outitits lalieady have natening nails. They it y y fingers perfectly, since the vidths, cuivatures and lengths are based on ay natural nails. All I need is adhesive nail tabs, thin enough to fit the grooves, luaps and ridges of ay natural nails, to allov the acpylics to al lost snap in place. Because the fit is so perfect, I have less concern about a nail popping off; just be sure to clean your nails thoroughly prior to applying the tabs
While acrylics aren't cheap ( $\$ 25-435$ a set), they last, are easy to re-use, and the polish doesn't flake off. I now have eight sets of nails, each set a different color, to aatch ay var lous color schenes. I keep then in ziplock bags, one for each finger (NOT one for each set). This ray, it's easy to find the right nail for each finger.

MAKING THE REAL ONES LOOK GOOD by Tarri Fisher

This is a step-by-step sumary st a manicure the vay it should be done:

1. Clip or file the nails and bevel, remenbering to file in one direction only
2. Use a ruby (finishing) stone on nail ends
3. Soak hands in vari soapy vater for 3 to 5 minutes
4. Use cuticle renover.
5. Use cuticle "pusher" or orange stick to renove the cuticle fron the base of the nail bed.
6. Use a nail whitener to clean out underneath the nails
7. Apply lotion on the nails, hands and wrists.
8. Renove the lotion with a brush, soap and vater, and dry your hands.
9. Use nail polish renover to remove oil fron the nail bed.
10. Apply a clear base coat to the nails. Try to cover the entire nail in three strokes.
11. Apply the color coat the sane vay as the base; use two coats.
12. Apply top coat.
13. Spray on nail dryer; never have a fan going if you use this as it can cause cluaping of the polish.

Practice, of course, is the key to having better looking nails, and extra care and attention to hygiene can only reap benefits. Hovever, if you vant that "expert" look, spend the money to have a professional nanicure!

If the shoe fits, it's ugly. All too often, this seens to be the guiding spirit when thoosing wonen's shoes. The trick is to select shoes that are coth aitractive and confortable. The good nevs is that this conbination is nov available nore than ever before. It has taken longer for the principles of good valking or aerobic shoe engineering to appear in women's shoes than in men's.
When shopping, keep certain principles in aind. Above all, make sure they are confor table. This first and highest hurdle for many of us is hov to have the opportunity to leisurely try on shoes. For sone, aill order ay be the route to follow. The obvious hazard is that the shoes ay not it properly. But also, you can't evaluate thes for the unny factors that go into a properly ade shoe. For others, a quick and furtive try-on at a sell-serve shoe store is an option, especially if you aren't crossdressed. I vas nervous, but enjoyed going as Jennif er to Nordstrons, where a salesnan carefully fitted a pair of Easy Spirit pumps vith two inch heels. I bought then and valked around Nordstroas. for half an hour, feeling the shoes to be a bit too snug. I returned to the shoe section and requested that the shoes be stretched. The salesnan graciously conplied and lhave enjoyed vearing then since. This, of course, is the ideal way to choose your shoes but can be a bit seary.
Gone tips on selecting shoes: They should be confortable when you purchase then. Don't expect to break then in' or assume they vill stretch vith vearing. Leather or fabric
will tand to sold to your foot as vell as "breathe". Plastic uppers will do nei ther
bur feet are frequently different sizes. For this reason, your feet should be neasured (idealiy, the old-fashioned way), aspecially the larger foot Alvays try on both shoes and buy the size for the larger foot. There should be a thumb's vidth between the end of the big toe and the shoe tip
Cook for quality anufacturing in teras of strength, durability, snooth stitching, and finished edges.
Avoid extreme styles such as very high heels or platforas. The ideal hee! raises the foot about is' above the ball of the foot. Don't go above a $2^{\prime \prime}$ heel. Leather soles are desirable and resist punctures. Rubber or conposition heels are superior to plastic. I've replaced oy plastic heels regardiess of the degree of wear
A flexible sole is essential; alvays flex the sole in your hand. At the same tine, a firi shank should stiffen the sole fros the heel to the ball of the foot. It should be fire and unbending, providing support to the longitudinal foot arch in the underlying sloping part of the sfoe. The flexible part of the sole should be just in front of the shank. A nev and essential feature is the cushioned insole. Easy Spirit seens to have pioneered this, with television ads showing high-heeled vonen (or TVs?) playing basketball. Easy Spipit

ads now feature a shoe designed for shopping（shop till you drop！）．Less expensive brands have followed their lead and nov confortable punps are videspread．I urge you not to buy shoes that lack either flexible soles or cushloned insoles． As you get oider，you sepsesially need shoes that cushion the shock of foot iopack（＂Cross－Talk＂，Appil）．The fatty cushion in your poot thine out，creating a greater need for a Eushioned insole．
io get an idea if your shoe vill fit properly，check that it is wider than your forefoot（the ball of your toes） Trace an oukline around your forefoot while standing．Then place the shoe over the outline and see which is vider．If your foot is wider，a variety of foot ailments can result． Bad shoes can cause or aggravate the foot problens described in the previous article．Remenber，your feet spread vith activity such as walking or even standing．They suell in the afternoon and evening and those are the better tines to buy your shoes．

Make sure there is enough roon in the toebox by viggling your toes．The ball of the foot should fit confortably in the shoe．The heel should itt snugly and have a fira heel counter．The instep shouldn＇t gape open－－this is especially common in wide widths．

High heels are fun．They make our legs look more feninine and cause us to valk sexier．But if you valk too nuch in then，the toes are cranped，the feet are strained，and the body alignment is changed froe the usual resulting in a svayed back and potential backache．
In sumary，buying women＇s shoes should be the nost inportant purchases in your feninine vardrobe．No other items of clothing if chosen badly，can lead to so many heal th problens．Choose carefully and deliberately．Fantasy has no place in the selection of confortable shoes．Take sone risks of being read and don＇t be too frugal．Be aware
of the appropriate styles，colors，ets，but ake propep fit and foot confort be your lodestar．As the old shoe polish jingle said，＂If you yore shoes upon your head，you＇d make sure they looked neat＂

HELPFUL HINT：Ever vear a pair of vilte shoes that vere all sculfed with lots of black na＂ks all over then？Try nail polish remover for removing tas and grease（but only on leather，not on plastic）．And vnite shoe polish will go on evenly if you rub your shoes vith rubbing alcohol before applying．Finally，spraying your white shoes with hair spray and letting it dry will keep the polish from snearing

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SpOUSE KNOUS ABOUT IT, KEEP THE LINES OF COMmUNICATION OPEM Sone of us tell our vives ve crossdress and sone don't. The only way to tell if you should is to use common sense. Renenber, you can avoid a lot of fights by telling her what you do, and, if possible, by asking hep permission regarding then and where to do it. Often, it is possible to reach a mutual agreenent about your "hobby" and to lind a time when your crossdressing can be convenient for both yife and nusband.
THERE ARE TIMES WHEN YOUR WIFE WANTS HER HUSBANO, NOT
ANOTHER WOMAN. Let your vife see the aan she narpied on a
regular basis. Sone crossdressers become so adept at transforning thenselves into women that they have very clear-cut alternate personalities. thile the vife aay becone good friends vith that alternate personality, her husband's feninine side nay not be enough at tines. Sonetimes, no girlifiend -- even if she is actually a hustand wearing vomen's clothes -- vill do. Your vife needs you as a man!
ESTABLISA SOHE KIND OF AGREEHENT REGAROING ATTIRE FOR SLEEPING AND SEX. You aay be terribly turned on by crossdressing and nay feel like naking love to your wife innediately after you change out of your dress. Your vife wany need a little tine to alake the transition betveen your fenme self and you. Sone wonen, for exanple, are turned off when they see bra strap apks still on your body. K.J., for example, has an unusually sharp sense of sneli, and she had a problen vith the scents of aakeup and perfume on ne. Our solution was siaple; I take a bath after I have undressed, and she says then I smell like a ata again. Every vonan is different. Sone don't care if you wear lingerie to bed, but others siaply hate it. If you're not sure, ask! If she's not certain what she likes and what she doesn't, experiment together
MOST VOMEN STILL THINK THIS IS SOMETHING UHICH UILL 60 AUAY AND YIL TOLERATE YOUR BEHAYIOR TO BEGIN YITH, THEN RESENT CROSSDRESSING HEN THEY BEGIN TO REALIZE IT'S' NOT A TEMPORARY CONOITION. A big problea nou has to be dealt with, and hoy you do this is up to you. I handled it by being conpletely honest. Sone of the resentrent is triggered by the lact that one or both of you is uninforaed about crossdrassing. Sonetines only one or two specific aspects of crossdressing are causing the resentaent and a wiliingness to be flexible and conpronise can solve the problen. ? handled this by keeping out comaunications about ay "hobby' open and honest. This nade a major difference in our relationship.
SOMETIMES A WOMAN WANI'S TO HELP, BUT HER SUGGESTIONS MAY SOUNO LIKE CRITICISA TO YOU. Here;s the situation You've just shown your nev vife your entire wardrobe, all the
wigs and things, and she isn't happy about it at all. If she says "Real wonen vouldn't be caught dead booking like whores in those six inch heels and 4000 bras, and nobody vould leave her house veaping guch garish rakeup', don't get ald and insulted. Listen? She's trying to help you pass in public. She has taken an interest and is villing to try and teach you the things she learned when she vas just a teenager. The best thing to do, nost of the tiae, is to take her advice. This wil! snow her you respect her and you're willing to try, and she'll appreciate it. You'll even look better if you take her advice and stop vearing red next to your face because it a akes you look pale and sick, and try that shade of blue she suggests. She aight even be i mpressed enough to help you sfiop!

I felt that I was the epitome of everything unfeninine. The only two things l really had in ay favor were drive and attiude. My voice was so deep that l had to pretend ! had laryngitis when ! went out dressed

My first step vas to go out late at night driving around, Next ! began going to an outdoor shopping center which had closed for the night. I vould stop the car and go over to a drink machine and get a coke. I was now out in public -- it really didn't aat tep that there vas no public there to see we. Nonetheless, this was an iaportant step, sinilar to a child learning to walk. Each step builds confidence

After any little siailar occasions, ay first real outing was to a distant town for a business meeting I decided to arrive the night before as Bobbi Renee.
