Thanks for Caring



Dr. Peo, a noted sexologist and long-time friend of the transgendered community, was the author of the popular advice column on gender issues, Roger's Notebook. Yvonne Cook, IFGE Director of Operations, stated, "He was one of the first psychotherapists to become actively involved with the gender community. Roger was there for a lot of people over the years who needed his knowledge and help. He will be missed."

In recognition of his many contributions and achievements, the IFGE Board of Directors dedicated the eighth annual Coming Together - Working Together convention to Dr. Peo.
