

'Coming Together' Convention Programs: A Feast of Fun. Ideas, and Inspiration.

We are proud to offer a fuller, more enticing schedule of programs than ever before. Just look at this range of programs:

General Programs:

Everyone is an equal partner in our community, including female and male crossdressers and transsexuals, wives and partners, friends, allied professionals, and support services. We designed the programs accordingly, with something for everyone. However, there is always enough diversity so each person can find programs to fit their interests, and "vote with their feet".

Host Organizations Programs:

One of the best ways to really enjoy a convention is to get out of the hotel at times and see the sights! The Gender Identity Center of Denver and the Delta Chapter -Tri Ess are working hard to organize trips and outings to show you a great time "on the town".

Transsexual (TS) Programs:

A special three-day program dealing entirely with transsexual issues will be conducted Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. (Friday's and Saturday's programs will concentrate on Male-to-Female issues, functioning cooperatively with the Femaleto-Male program.)





Female-to-Male (F-M) Programs:

A special two-day program dealing entirely with female-to-male crossdressing and transsexual issues will be conducted Friday and Saturday.

Wives and Partners Programs:

For the first time ever, on Friday and Saturday we are offering special programs focused on issues concerning the wives and partners of crossdressers and transsexuals.

Mental Health Professional Programs:

Aunique two-day program for mental health professionals, coordinated by Roger Peo, Ph.D. (Pres., Androgyny Unlimited), will be presented on Friday and Saturday.

"Behind the Scenes" Worker Programs:

As important as all the other programs are, this is where the "real work" of our community gets done. We invite everyone who would like to become actively involved in our community to participate in these "behind the scenes" committee meetings. These meetings review the work that was done the previous year, and plan the action items for the coming year.

'Trinity Awards':

About the 'Coming Together' Convention

Q Who is the Convention for?

A It is for males and females who crossdress, or are transgendered, or transsexually inclined. It is for wives, partners, and friends of CD/TG/TS people. It is for medical and mental health professionals, social workers, educators, and researchers. In fact, it is for anyone interested in the cross-dressing and transsexual phenomena.

Q What are the Convention's objectives?

- A (1) To use the issues that concern the CD/TS Community as a platform from which to address the issues which concern us all ... bringing people together to work together to build a better and brighter future for all.
- (2) To provide a broad-based educational opportunity for members of the CD/TS Community and members of the General Public who wish to learn more about CD/TS issues that concern or interest them
- (3) To strengthen the bonds of our community by promoting greater understanding of our differences and similari-

ties, respect for each other's differences and needs, a sense of caring for each other, a willingness to put out some effort on each other's behalf, and do so in an atmosphere of pride and dignity and joy.

(4) To provide an opportunity for our community's current and future leaders to become directly involved in the issues that affect our community

Q I.F.G.E. is the Convention's sponsor. What is I.F.G.E.?

A The International Foundation for Gender Education is a non-profit tax exempt educational resource for cross-dressing and transsexual issues.
