The convention was a busy 5 days crammed with seminars, luncheons, and many small informal meetings with representatives of the groups, discussing common needs, desires and problems. Highlights included speaking engagements by Dr. Richard Docter, Merrissa Sherill Lynn and our guest of honor, Christine Jorgensen (a witty, quick and truly fascinating individual who I'm sure influenced many of us in our decisions to pursue this lifestyle). The seminars covered topics from peer counselling to how to produce a good newsletter and were all very well done. All presentations were audio taped and will be transcribed and published by IFGE.

In retrospect, this convention proved to me that the CD/TV/TG/TS community shares much in common. We all are striving to explore a

side of our nature that we have had to live with all our lives and although we all have our own ways of dealing with the issues and desires we face, there are many common threads from person to person, and group to group that serve to bind us all into a community. The IFGE can be a force to unite that community now and in the future.

During the week, I learned quite a bit about the current state of affairs at IFGE and came to the conclusion that new leadership was needed to propel this organization into a force that has the grass roots support of all of the individuals and associated groups, sharing resources and knowledge for the common good. On the last day of the convention the board meeting was held and the first order of business was announcing the results of the recent board election. I had received enough votes throughout the country and it was announced that I and several others were now official board members. The next order of business was the election of a new chairman of the board. I had given this position much thought during the week and it was known that I was interested. Well, my aspirations came true, almost at lightning speed (or so it seemed), I was nominated, elected and was running my first board meeting in a matter of minutes.

Time will tell if my efforts are successful in guiding this widely scattered and somewhat diverse collection of people and local groups through this second post convention year. I plan to concentrate on a few issues that I feel are key to IFGE's success through what I would call it's adolescent period. The following is a reprint of my first communication to the groups around the world that are associated with IFGE.

March 5, 1988

Greetings,

As some of you may have heard, a new chairman has been elected for the 1988-1989 year at IFGE, I am that person, and I would at this time, like to introduce myself to those of you who I have not met. I would also like to open up the lines of communication from myself to all of you.

This organization was conceived from dreams and now it is time that we start acting on those dreams to insure that they are fulfilled. Also, we should provide a fertile and sound environment for both IFGE and all the associated groups to work in harmony, now and in the future, to carry all our dreams through to fruition. Therefore, my main goal during this next year will be to provide guidance and to assure that the programs, services, publications and events established by the IFGE are maintained and enhanced by those responsible for their existence. The following are some of the priorities that I have set to accomplish this goal.

First of all, during the past year, IFGE has had some problems. These problems relate largely to the fact that our publication, "Tapestry", has had some major schedule slippages. This has created several related problems, since "Tapestry" is our main communication forum and also provides much of the revenue on which IFGE depends. This periodical is recognized as the "world class" journal of our culture, and it's timely publication is at the top of my list of priorities.

Other issues that I will be concentrating on relate largely to the services that IFGE provides to our associated groups around the world. Keeping these groups informed of IFGE business and enhancing the services that we offer associated groups will be my second priority. In order to better keep the groups informed, a quarterly update of IFGE activities and committee progress will be instituted. Each IFGE committee will contribute to this report. As the committees formulate new services, such as the national speaker's bureau, the formulation of an expanded publication service and as progress of the 1989 convention occurs we will be informing the local groups via this report.

A third priority that I will be working toward in the next year is the formulation of a structure, made up of associated groups,

that will work with the board of directors in formulating policy, activities and board membership. My goal here is to have a congress of groups convene at the next convention with all associated groups represented. In order to get the ball rolling, I would like to have all associated groups select individuals that will represent them in this congress and forward these names to IFGE c/o my office.

Lastly, events will be another priority on which I will be concentrating during the next year. We all look forward to attending events that relate to our culture, and we are now starting the planing process for the 1989 IFGE convention to be held in San Francisco. Suggestions are now being welcomed on this convention's form and content. We have learned that we need to have a more varied and diverse agenda that will appeal to a larger cross section of our community, and your inputs will hopefully make the '89 convention a tremendous success. Continuing on the events subject, the possibility also exists for seminars or regional events sponsored by associated groups, to be sanctioned as IFGE co-sponsored events. Associated groups are encouraged to contact us to arrange for speakers, etc.. Please direct any comments, suggestions or inquiries regarding events to our programs committee.

In conclusion, I would again like to reiterate that I am opening up the channels of communication with all our associated groups. I encourage comments, ideas, criticisms and dreams (IFGE was once only a dream !) to my attention. I am only one person, but hopefully I can at least be an ear to listen to your thoughts, a voice to convey them and a body to push for them in the year to come.
