Sunday, March 14: Sunday for High Society

This event begins with a morning visit to the Philadelphia Museum of Art (FREE), followed by a 12:30 PM Brunch in the Swan Room at the exclusive Four Seasons Hotel (\$27.50 plus tip & tax). This will be followed by a concert in the city (cost and location TBD). The brunch requires reservations and is limited in attendence to 12 people.

Monday, March 15: Atlantic City Casino Trip & Λn Evening at La Cage
