WHAT TO DO

DON'T attempt to flee, or evade arrest, if a police officer challenges you.

DON'T attempt to bargain with the arresting officer, or with any other officer.

DON'T give any statement whatever, whether written or oral.

DON'T give any information as to your job, or the identity of your employer.


DON'T admit or deny the charge which the arresting officer places against you.

DO follow the officer peacefully to the police station if he decides to take you there.

DO insist upon contacting an attorney or public defender as soon as you arrive at the police station.

DO request postponement of your court appearance if your attorney is not in the courtroom. DON'T discuss your case with another prisoner, or anyone other than your attorney, before trial.


